Canada has a very busy year in 2019 we have the inter-Provincial tournament in early July.

There are two CNSA tournaments, one in May and the other in late July.

Our western provinces are very much improved as far as membership. Edmonton Alberta is starting a new club and they already have over 100 members.

Our eastern provinces are picking up a few more members as well.

In Ontario we are trying to increase our amateur membership. In Coldwater Ontario (a small town in the northern Ontario) they have a membership of over 175 - mainly Amateurs.
